### ABD Announces Public Meeting on Greenwich Road Tolls

As the Association of British Drivers (ABD) has received an enormous response to our leaflet on the proposed congestion charge in Greenwich, but Transport for London still have not published their detailed proposals, we have decided to hold some public meetings anyway as we promised to do. The first one will be on Saturday the 22<sup>nd</sup> September commencing at 11.00 am. The venue is Mycenae House in Blackheath – address: 90 Mycenae Road, London, SE3 7SE.

Note that the idea of some form of congestion charging is clearly still very much alive as can be seen from the recent response to a petition put up on the No.10 web site which said "*Transport for London and Greenwich Council are exploring the feasibility of a range of options to cut traffic growth and deter unnecessary journeys in Greenwich.*" (see <http://www.pm.gov.uk/output/Page13016.asp> for the full response).
